

ROGER BEAN created the long-running off-Broadway hit *The Marvelous Wonderettes* (18 months at the Westside Theatre), along with the sequels *Wonderettes: Caps & Gowns* and *Winter Wonderettes*. Original cast albums for all three shows in the Wonderettes franchise are available from iTunes and Amazon. *The Marvelous Wonderettes* received the 2007 LA Ovation Award for Best Musical for its long-running Los Angeles production, and continues to be an audience favorite year after year in regional and amateur theater companies throughout the country.

Mr. Bean revisits Springfield, USA with his newest jukebox hit *Life Could Be A Dream*, and with a record-breaking 12-month run in Los Angeles, the show received the Los Angeles Drama Critics Circle Award, the LA Weekly Theatre Award and the Backstage Garland Award

for Outstanding Musical in 2010. Other musicals created by Mr. Bean include *Summer of Love, Route 66, Why Do Fools Fall In Love?* and *The Andrews Brothers*. All are currently available through licensing agent Steele Spring Stage Rights.
